Current situation

The site is very overgrown and the traces of the remains are not clear although there are vague outlines of the platforms or foundations of the Monastery buildings. A sketch has been made showing the possible arrangements of the buildings in the complex. On the site there are many red bricks lying on the ground and the remains of an incense-burner.

Oral Histories

Luvsannyam was a famous philosopher monk who lived and studied in Davkharin Khiid. He lived from 1904 to 1994 and is buried in a graveyard in Barjin. Luvsannyam had his own house in the Davkhar area. He was so renowned for his knowledge that the 14th Dalai Lama came to Zaamar in 1979 to pray with him. The main dharma protector of Davkharin Khiid was Chojjoo, the Lord of Death, who is usually shown in paintings riding on a blue bull.
